

Dear Town of Springville Residents,

LRS is proud to announce new, CARTED, curbside trash and recycle collection service for the residents in the Town of Springville beginning Wednesday, October 4th!

LRS will deliver one new trash cart and one new recycle cart in late September. Carts will be placed near your fire number sign, so please be on the look out and move carts up near your home or in your garage. On your service day, carts should be placed near the curb, 3 feet from any obstruction, and 3 feet between carts on trash and recycle day. Walking between containers is a good rule of thumb, or place one container on the left side of the driveway and the other container on the right.

## **COLLECTION PROGRAM GUIDELINES:**

- Trash and recycling must be curbside by 5:00 a.m. on your designated collection day,
- All waste / recycling materials must be INSIDE of the carts, waste or bags outside of the carts will not be taken.

## WASTE (trash, garbage, refuse):

Your trash cart will be serviced every week based on the enclosed calendar. Solid waste is what most of us think of as "trash", "refuse" or "garbage" that is produced at home, work or leisure. This category does NOT include any of the recyclable items listed below, any household hazardous waste, liquid latex paint, yard waste, appliances, electronics or construction debris. (no concrete, rock, large construction waste items.)

## **BULK ITEM SERVICE:**

<u>Bulk "pay-per-item"</u> option is available year round. Email <u>bltownservice@lrsrecycles.com</u> or call (608) 580-0580 to arrange services and make payment for collection. Item(s) must be <60 lbs and manageable by one person (or broken down into manageable pieces), no yard waste, no tires, no hazardous material, no waste oils, and no liquids.

## **RECYCLING:**

Your recycling cart will be serviced every other week based on the enclosed calendar. (see flip side) The following items are banned from Wisconsin landfills and as a result should be placed in your recycling cart for proper processing, handling and/or reuse:

- Aluminum containers, glass containers, steel containers (tin/aluminum cans)
- Bi-metal containers (containers made from a combination of steel and aluminum)
- Corrugated cardboard (corrugated cardboard cut into pieces no larger than 3' x 3')
- Newspaper, magazines, and other materials printed on newsprint, or mixed paper
- Plastic containers #1-7: milk jugs, laundry detergent bottles, soda & water bottles, etc.
